ANNOUNCEMENT

The Dean of the Faculty of Applied Informatics and Mathematics of Warsaw University of Life Sciences – SGGW calls for a post of an

Assistant Professor in the field **Economic Science in Information Technology**

The applicant must fulfill requirements of the regulations contained in art. 114 of the act of July 27th 2005. – Higher Education Law Act (Dz. U. no 164 item 1365 with the amendment article no 1 item 91 of March 18th 2011) and in the Statute of Warsaw University of Life Sciences – SGGW (Att. 6 item 9).

The position of Assistant Professor requires the following:

1. A PhD in Economic Science or Mathematic Science in field of Econometrics, or Statistics, or Information Technology, or Financial Engineering.
2. At least four published papers in reviewed journals.
3. Positive opinion of the faculty didactic committee on teaching skills or for non faculty employees positive opinion about a lecture delivered during the Department Meeting.
4. Fluent command of the Polish language (at least on the C1 level).

The applicant should apply for the job in a written form addressed to the Dean of the Faculty with the following attachments:

- personal questionnaire with two photos;
- CV;
- copy of the PhD diploma;
- list of published papers and papers accepted for publication (with confirmation of the publisher);
- references from the previous employer;
- certificate of employment;
- candidate statement that fulfills the requirements in the Higher Education Law (article 109 item 1). (forms are available in Staff Office);
- certificate from doctor of occupational medicine.

The application form should be submitted till **March 31st 2012** to the Department of Econometrics and Statistics of WULS-SGGW, Nowoursynowska Street 166, 02-787 Warsaw.

Contest adjudication is due to **April 4th 2012**. The results will be available on the website of the Faculty on **April 6th 2012**.
